# 2025 The Year That Was

The 2025 season marked another significant chapter in the proud history of the Williamstown Football Club, underpinned by strong community support, committed partnerships, and the tireless efforts of staff, volunteers and supporters across all areas of the Club.

Throughout 2025, the Club continued to strengthen its position both on and off the field. Our VFL men's program demonstrated resilience and competitiveness, finishing the home-and-away season in tenth position and qualifying for the finals series. While our campaign concluded with an elimination final loss to the Casey Demons (132-56), the season provided valuable development opportunities and laid important foundations for future success.

Our VFLW program once again showcased the strength and growth of women's football at Williamstown. Finishing fifth at the conclusion of the regular season, the team progressed to finals before being defeated by back-to-back premiers North Melbourne (41-17). The performance of the VFLW side reflected the dedication of players, coaches and support staff, and reinforced the Club's ongoing commitment to the advancement of women's football.

None of the Club's achievements in 2025 would have been possible without the extraordinary support of our broader Williamstown community. We extend our sincere thanks to Ian Smith, the Club's Number 1 Ticket Holder, for his continued loyalty and advocacy. We also acknowledge the Federal Member for Gellibrand, the Hon. Tim Watts MP, Hobsons Bay City Council, and all Councillors and staff for their ongoing support of the Club.

We are grateful to the AFL and AFL Victoria staff for their guidance and assistance throughout the season, as well as to the management and staff at Newport Social for their continued partnership and hospitality.

# Paul Northey, CEO

It has been a genuine privilege to be appointed Chief Executive Officer of the Williamstown Football Club. Williamstown is a club rich in history, shaped by generations of proud players, volunteers, members, and supporters. Its sustained success, on and off the field, reflects an unwavering commitment to community, tradition, and leadership within the Victorian Football League and the broader AFL system.

The club continues to operate from a position of strength. We are stable, well resourced, and united in purpose. At the same time, we recognise the increasingly competitive environment in which all VFL clubs now operate. Both the Board and the Executive Team are acutely aware of our responsibility to continue strengthening the club's financial foundations and to advocate effectively for the critical role the VFL plays in the football ecosystem—and for Williamstown's ongoing prominence within it.



## Investment in Facilities

A major milestone in 2025 was the significant refurbishment of our football facilities at DSV Stadium, undertaken with the valued support of the AFL, as well as State and Local Governments. Phase 1 of the Master Plan Delivered:

- New **changerooms** and **medical facilities**
- **Upgraded** coaches' spaces and a **theatrette**
- A **newly fitted gym** with modern equipment for our playing groups
- **Improved** kitchen and associated operational areas.

This investment ensures our players and staff are supported by high-quality, contemporary infrastructure. Looking ahead, the club remains committed to pursuing Stage 2 of the Master Plan, which includes further changerroom developments and a dedicated gym facility. Our Morris Street home is a community hub, and we will continue working closely with government partners and other stakeholders to ensure it remains an asset for both football and the broader community.

## Financial Sustainability

Our purpose is clear—to be a leader in the VFL for both men's and women's football. Achieving this requires sustained and substantial investment across coaching, high-performance, medical, and operational programs. As a fully independent club with no ongoing AFL funding, Williamstown must continue to build strong and diverse revenue streams.

Our sponsors remain fundamental to our success. Their generous support underpins our ability to operate high-performance football programs, and I sincerely thank each of them for their continued partnership in 2026. The visibility of the Williamstown Football Club in the VFL/AFL environment as well as our location in the heart of the thriving Western Suburbs of Melbourne provides a compelling opportunity for business and partners and we are dedicated to connecting and providing value to our sponsors and partners in return for their support.

Membership and match-day income also play essential roles. Members are at the heart of Williamstown. In 2025, our membership totalled 1,056, and match-day revenue reached was stable. Growing our membership will be a major strategic focus in 2026.

Off the field, the club continues to operate commercial ventures solely to support our football programs. Newport Social remains an important contributor to club cashflow, and we continue to operate Seaview at DSV Stadium as a function and event venue. Our investment portfolio, managed by JBWere, reflects the prudent stewardship of the club over many generations and continues to provide financial strength and stability. The club reported an operating surplus of \$994,584 in 2025, significantly supported by government grants associated with the DSV Stadium redevelopment. Sponsorship revenue grew by 10%, while revenue from Newport Social and Seaview softened in line with challenging market conditions. Our managed investment portfolio delivered strong returns, that helped support cashflow and overall performance throughout the year.

## Football Performance

Our core purpose is to support and develop high-standard football programs. The VFL is the second-highest level of football in Australia, and competing at this level demands excellence in resourcing, recruiting, coaching, and high-performance operations. We continually challenge ourselves to ensure we are meeting the standards required to compete for success. Both our VFL and VFLW teams had strong seasons and we are thankful to our senior coaches, Justin Plapp (VFL), who has been reappointed for 2026 and Liam Cavanagh (VFLW), who has finished with the club after three years and provided exceptional leadership through that time. We welcome Paul Groves as VFLW Senior Coach who has been signed on for the next two seasons.

## Community and Acknowledgements

The heartbeat of Williamstown remains its people. Our community continues to inspire and sustain us. We were again active and visible in the community throughout 2025, and we will continue to deepen that connection in the years ahead.

I want to acknowledge and thank the many individuals who make this club what it is:

- Our dedicated staff, whose passion and professionalism drive our daily operations
- Our coaches, players, and medical teams, who strive to represent Williamstown with pride and excellence
- Our loyal volunteers, who contribute countless hours to ensure the club functions smoothly

# Football Report

Troy West, Vice President & Football Director

On behalf of the Board, I am pleased to present the 2025 Football Report for the Williamstown Football Club. The season was defined by competitiveness, growth and the continued strengthening of both our VFL and VFLW programs.

Our VFL side completed the home-and-away season with a 10-8 record, securing 10th position and a place in the Wildcard Finals. In an even and highly competitive competition, this result reflected the resilience and consistency of the playing group. The season included several standout performances. A thrilling 108-105 victory over Southport, highlighted by four late goals, demonstrated the group's composure under pressure. Strong wins over Carlton and Geelong showcased our capacity to defend resolutely and score efficiently, while close contests against top-ranked sides confirmed that we remain capable of matching it with the best teams in the league.

Individually, Brodie McLaughlin delivered another outstanding campaign, averaging 3.7 goals per game, earning selection in the Smithy's VFL Team of the Year and polling 17 votes in the J.J. Liston Trophy. Our defensive unit, led by Luke Parks, who also represented Victoria, was selected in the VFL Team of the Year and was our Best and Fairest, provided stability and leadership across the year. Importantly, 2025 saw the continued regeneration of our list. We proudly introduced four debutants, along with three senior club debutants: integration into senior football reflects the strength of our development pathway and long-term planning.

Our VFLW program continued its upward trajectory finishing the home-and-away season with an 8-6 record to secure 5th position and progress to the Semi Final. The group displayed consistency and maturity, highlighted by a dominant 47-point win over Geelong and a composed Elimination Final over Sandringham. Although our finals campaign concluded in the Semi Final, the experience gained will serve the program well moving forward. Midfielder Emily Eaves was deservedly recognised, sharing the rebel VFLW Coaches MVP Award, earning VFLW Team of the Year honours (polling 17 votes in the Lambert-Pearce Medal) and was the club's Best and Fairest — an exceptional individual season. Jemima Wrigley was also a deserving selection in the VFLW Team of the Year.

The growth of the women's program was further reflected in the introduction of new talent. We welcomed seven VFLW debutants. In addition, we introduced seven senior club debutants. Their impact reinforces the depth and sustainability of our women's football program.

Looking forward, across both programs, finals participation, maintaining a strong retention rate and the successful integration of new recruits provide clear evidence that our football department is building with purpose. The VFLW program welcomes new coach Paul Groves, while Justin Plapp continues as coach of our VFL program. I thank our players, coaches, football staff and volunteers for their dedication and professionalism throughout the season. The standards they uphold continue to honour the proud history of Williamstown Football Club, and I look forward to what lies ahead.



# Tributes



## *Col* **COLQUHOUN**

Col Colquhoun passed away on December 30, 2025 in Newcastle, NSW, aged 93. After arriving at Williamstown from South Melbourne, he played 55 senior games from 1958–61 and was a key full-back in the club's 1958 and 1959 premierships. He later served as a committeeman and chairman of selectors, receiving Life Membership in 1966.

## *Janet* **DOOLEY**

Janet Dooley was a beloved Williamstown figure whose service to the club spanned more than six decades, including her remarkable role as Canteen Manager from 1953 to 2014. A passionate volunteer and fundraiser, she became a Life Member and was the first female inducted into the club's Hall of Fame in 2014. Her legacy is honoured through the "best person" award and the canteen named in her recognition.

## *Tony 'Moose'* **PHILPOT**

Tony "Moose" Philpot passed away on November 6, 2025, aged 67, and was the uncle of current Seagulls player Max Philpot. He joined Williamstown in 1978 and played 41 senior games, kicking 43 goals in the #3 jumper through to 1981. Tony later enjoyed a strong playing and coaching career across multiple clubs, including premiership success with Albion FC.

## *Tony* **WALSH**

Former player Tony Walsh passed away on August 26, 2025, aged 65. After progressing through Williamstown's Thirds and Seconds, he played 21 senior games and kicked 20 goals between 1978 and 1981 in the #45 jumper. A proud Western suburbs local, Tony was also a talented cricketer and a passionate Collingwood supporter.

## *Roger* **SIMPSON**

Roger Simpson passed away on September 1, 2025, aged 75. He served on the Williamstown Football Club Board from 1992–95 and was a past president and long-time treasurer of The Gulls coterie group. Roger was also an inaugural member of the reformed Gulls in 1990 and remained a dedicated supporter for over a decade.

## *John* **MARTIN**

John "Dasher" Martin passed away on August 7, 2025, aged 92, as the last remaining member of Williamstown's 1954 premiership team. Across 133 games from 1952–58, he became one of the club's greatest players, winning the 1956 Liston Medal and featuring in four premierships. John later enjoyed an outstanding coaching and playing career in regional football and remained connected to Williamstown through roles including chairman of selectors.

## *Barry* **BEITZEL**

Dual premiership player Barry Beitzel passed away on February 26, 2025, aged 90. After beginning his career in Gippsland and playing two senior games for Carlton, he joined Williamstown in 1957 and played 48 games through to 1960.
